**Dog Training Tip** 

When training your dog, use a treat that won't cause crumbs. Hotdogs make great training treats, because the dog will eat it quickly and give his attention right back to you! Crumbs can be distracting, since they will want to eat every morsel before giving their attention back to you. Also, keep in mind the size of the dog -- if one hotdog will fill your tummy, compare your size to your dog's size. One hotdog will make about 30 treats for a medium to large-sized dog, or 60 treats for a small dog. The rewards don't have to be big -- just tasty!
