Wild and Feral passes the 200 mark, with the help of the local spay clinic

Our Wild and Feral division has passed the 200 mark! As of the end of September, over 200 feral and free-roaming felines have been speutered at three local clinics, with the majority being done at the Pulaski County Humane Society clinic under the PetSmart charities grant they have. This helps keep Wild and Feral's expenses down and we can use the donations you have made to pay for those "emergency" surgeries (pregnant cats that can't wait for the next clinic, for example) that crop up.

The trapping is being done mostly by the caretakers themselves. We purchased 25 trapping books from Alley Cat Allies and the trappers borrow them at the time of trapping. This really helps the cats as they are then properly trapped and cared for before and after surgery.

Caretakers are starting to spread the word and more and more people are not only getting their cats speutered, but are beginning to understand and embrace ear tipping. This extremely important part of the process prevents cats from being trapped over and over as well as buys them extra time at the pound in the event they are ever taken in.
